Kerri D. Holloway is Vice President and CRA officer at the Bank of New York Mellon, responsible for regulatory reporting and compliance including oversight of the bank's SBIC investments.

Kerri 's career which spans the public, private and non-profit sectors began as an owner's representative at Silverstein Properties, Inc., one of New York's major landlords where she was a portfolio manager for prime commercial office buildings in midtown and downtown. Later employed by New York City, she led teams that leased all municipal office space in privately owned buildings and maximized revenues from the City's economic development projects including real estate, small business and bond financing for corporate retention.

At the Local Initiatives Support Corporation, one of the nation's largest non-profits, as Vice President, Kerri invested the nation's first urban retail equity fund created by institutional investors to build supermarket-anchored shopping centers in underserved communities in New Haven, Chicago, Dallas and the Bronx. As an entrepreneur, prior to joining BNY Mellon, her economic development clients included the Pfizer Corporation, The Apollo Theater Foundation, as well as the cities of Bridgeport, West Haven, and New Haven in Connecticut.

Kerri received an M.B.A. from Baruch College, a post-graduate diploma in real estate investment and analysis from New York University and a B.S. from Northwestern University.
